Leaving Your Mark

As a graduate or friend of The University of Toledo, you can leave your mark at UT by establishing an endowed fund. Your tax-deductible gift to the UT Foundation to create an endowment will provide a generous, permanent source of funding to benefit students, faculty, staff and the entire community.

Endowed funds are established with a minimum gift of \$25,000, contributed through one gift or by making a pledge over a period of five years or less. When a fund is “endowed,” gifts are preserved in perpetuity, and a portion of the annual earnings is used in support of a purpose designated by the donor. Endowments ensure a continual, reliable flow of funding for the University’s current and future needs.

Creating Your Fund

Donors may tailor an endowed fund to their own wishes and interests, choosing the fund’s name, purpose, area of use and other restrictions. For example, endowed funds may be created to support:

- scholarships and fellowships
- chairs, professorships and lectureships
- faculty awards and research grants
- academic programs
- athletic programs
- capital projects

Donors may also establish unrestricted endowments, to help the University—or a specific UT college, department or program—meet priority needs.

Ways of Giving

Endowments may be established through various gift vehicles.

Outright gifts include cash, negotiable securities, real estate, closely held stock, and other personal property such as art and jewelry. Corporate matching gifts can significantly increase the value—check with your company’s personnel office for details.

Planned gifts allow you to make a significant contribution now to benefit UT in the future. Planned giving vehicles, which may offer donors significant tax benefits, include:

- bequests
- real estate deeded to the UT Foundation
- charitable remainder trusts
- charitable lead trusts
- wealth replacement trusts
- charitable gift annuities
- retirement plans and IRAs
- life insurance policies

The individual funds listed within this publication are those funds which were fully endowed as of June 30, 2010. The balance noted is the fund’s total balance at that time, the end of the University’s and the Foundation’s fiscal year.

The University of Toledo Foundation has been designated as the official gift receiving organization for The University of Toledo. Contributions to the Foundation by individuals, corporations, organizations, and foundations qualify for tax deduction to the full extent provided by law. The UT Foundation is a 501(c)(3) organization for federal income tax purposes.

*This report reflects the University’s academic college structure as of June 2010. Changes, as of January 2011, include:

- Division of the College of Arts and Sciences into three individual colleges: The College of Languages, Literature and Social Sciences; the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics; and the College of Visual and Performing Arts.
- Merger of the Judith Herb College of Education and the College of Health Science and Human Service.
- Creation of the College of Innovative Learning.
- Establishment of the Honors College, from its previous status as a program.

College of Adult and Lifelong Learning (CALL)

Joanne L. and Ralph C. Cline Scholarship Fund (#301-095)

Fund Total: \$14,574

Established in 2004 by the late Ralph Cline, a marketing professional and former Toledo firefighter, in memory of his wife Joanne, Toledo business owner and sales director of a national network marketing company. Income from this fund supports scholarships for students in the College. Recipients shall be non-traditional students over the age of 30 who are returning to college, with a preference to women who are starting a new career or business.

Dean Mary Ann Heinrichs Scholarship (#300-117)

Fund Total: \$28,916

Established in 1981 by various donors and later renamed in honor of Mary Ann Heinrichs (Ed '62, MEd '65, PhD '73), professor emerita of education leadership and dean of the former University College. Income from this fund provides scholarships to CALL students, based on superior academic achievement.

Dean Ralph Kendall Memorial Fund (#300-033)

Fund Total: \$46,281

Established in 1967 by Margaret Kendall and others in memory of her husband Dr. Ralph Kendall, former dean of the Division of Continuing Education and former director of the Office of Evening and Special Services until his death in 1967. Income from this fund supports seminars related to the field of continuing education.

Elaine and Amos Patterson Scholarship (#300-966)

Fund Total: \$22,128

Established in 1999 by Dr. Amos Patterson, retired dean of the former University College and professor of education technology, and his late wife Elaine (EdS '79). Income from this fund provides scholarships for nontraditional female undergraduate students in the college. Preference is given to students returning to college and those with the greatest financial need.

Edith Rathbun Outreach and Engagement Fund (#301-331)

Fund Total: \$41,441

Established in 2004 by Edith Rathbun, retired secretary for Sunoco MidAmerica. Income from this fund is used to recognize and award UT faculty and staff for their work in scholarly outreach and engagement.

Edith Rathbun Scholarship Fund (#300-800)

Fund Total: \$169,696

Established in 1998 by Edith Rathbun, retired secretary for Sunoco MidAmerica. Income from this fund provides scholarships for nontraditional female students enrolled in CALL. Recipients must demonstrate financial need and may be part-time or full-time.

The William and Jean Vaughan Scholarship Fund (#300-776)

Fund Total: \$41,090

Established in 1997 and revised in 2007 by William Vaughan (Bus '57), president of the William Vaughan Co., and his wife

Jean (Bus '92). Income from this fund supports scholarships for CALL students demonstrating financial need and determination in obtaining a college degree.

Women's Advertising Club of Toledo Scholarship (#300-123)

Fund Total: \$15,790

Established in 1983 by the Women's Advertising Club of Toledo. Income from this fund provides scholarships to female juniors and seniors enrolled in CALL. Degree focus should reflect an interest in outreach (e.g., advertising, public relations, marketing, broadcasting or interpersonal communication). Recipients must be permanent residents of Toledo who meet academic standards.

College of Arts and Sciences

The Ability Center of Greater Toledo, Endowed Chair in Disability Studies (#301-097)

Fund Total: \$1,770,073

Established in 2001 by The Ability Center of Greater Toledo. Income from this fund supports an endowed chair in disability studies.

John D. Anderson Memorial Fund (#100-341)

Fund Total: \$10,255

Established in 1987 by the University of Toledo Board of Trustees in memory of John D. Anderson, general manager and senior partner of The Andersons. Mr. Anderson was also the first president and longtime board member of the UT Corporation (a predecessor to the UT Foundation). He received an honorary doctorate from UT in 1974. Income from this fund helps support the chair in Catholic Studies.

The Ariss Family Pre-Med Fund (#300-709)

Fund Total: \$12,068

Established in 1999 by Dr. Sonny and Laila Ariss and Dr. Steven and May Ariss. Dr. Sonny Ariss (Bus '78, MBA '81) is a professor in UT's College of Business Administration, and Dr. Steven Ariss is a Toledo area physician. Income from this fund provides scholarships for outstanding juniors or seniors who are biology majors in UT's pre-med program.

Art on the Mall Scholarship (#301-007)

Fund Total: \$22,942

Established in 2002 by the UT Alumni Association, through proceeds from the annual Art on the Mall event. Income from this fund provides merit-based scholarships for full-time students studying studio art, art history or art education.

Automatic Handling/Pienta Music Scholarship (#300-849)

Fund Total: \$31,315

Established in 1998 by David and Dorothy (A/S '84, A/S '89, MSN '99) Pienta through Automatic Handling, Inc. Mr. Pienta is president of the company, and Mrs. Pienta is the owner of Harmony & Health. Income from this fund supports scholarships for UT music majors.

Norman and Helen Baer Scholarship Fund (#300-355)

Fund Total: \$45,623

Established in 1984 by the estates of Norman F. Baer, an interior decorator, and his wife Helen, a longtime church organist, piano teacher, and past president of the Mu Phi Epsilon International Music Sorority. Income from this fund provides scholarships to exceptional piano students in the department of music.

The Jean Menzies Bennett Music Award (#300-695)

Fund Total: \$12,768

Established by the late Doris Bennett Williams in memory of her mother, and endowed through her estate in 1996. Income from this fund supports scholarships for deserving piano students.

Marianne Bigney Scholarship Award in German Studies (#300-166)

Fund Total: \$118,523

Established in 1986 in memory of Marianne Bigney, a former professor of German, by a portion of the Herbert Schering Fund, which had been established by Ms. Bigney. Income from this fund provides support for students enrolled in German studies, with preference given to those with a major or minor in German.

Jon M. Binder and Edward W. Binder Memorial Scholarship (#300-484)

Fund Total: \$28,943

Established in 1993 by the Binder family in memory of UT graduate Edward Binder and his son Jon Binder (A/S '91). Income from this fund provides scholarships to juniors and seniors majoring in political science who demonstrate sustained interest and success in other academic disciplines. Awards also are based on citizenship, involvement in student government, and intercollegiate athletics.

Arthur H. Black Award in Analytical Chemistry (#300-128)

Fund Total: \$24,770

Established in 1983 by the late Arthur H. Black (A/S '41, MS '48), former UT professor of chemistry and associate dean for the College of Arts and Sciences, and his wife Virginia (Ed '42). Income from this fund provides scholarships to undergraduate chemistry majors demonstrating outstanding ability in analytical chemistry.

Arthur H. Black Professorship (#301-088)

Fund Total: \$102,513

Established in 2001 by various donors in memory of the late Arthur H. Black (A/S '41, MS '48), former UT professor of chemistry and associate dean for the College of Arts and Sciences. Income from this fund is to support an endowed professorship, with the goal of eventually supporting a chair, in the department of chemistry.

Dr. Jeffrey A. Black Memorial Scholarship Fund (#300-809)

Fund Total: \$31,503

Established in 1998 in memory of Jeffrey Black (A/S '69) by his friend Terrence Perris (A/S '69), parents Arthur and Virginia Black, brother Curtis Black and his wife Marilyn, and others. Jeffrey Black was director of aquatic toxicology at EA

Laboratories in Sparks, Md. Income from this fund is used for scholarships for full-time juniors and seniors majoring in environmental science and demonstrating academic merit.

Paul Block Endowment Scholarship Fund (#300-354)

Fund Total: \$769,310

Established in 1983 by the Paul and Dina Block Foundation in memory of Paul Block, Sr., former publisher of The Blade. Income from this fund provides assistance for deserving and needy students enrolled in programs within the humanities. Recipients must be full-time undergraduate students demonstrating financial need, with renewals based on academic merit.

Howard H. M. Bowman Memorial Scholarship (#300-008)

Fund Total: \$86,124

Established in 1961 in memory of Dr. Howard Bowman, chairman emeritus of biology, who was a UT faculty member for 38 years. Income from this fund provides scholarships to students majoring in pre-medicine. Awards are based on scholarship, college entrance exams, and personal interviews.

Elmer R. and Gertrude M. Brigham Scholarship in Science (#300-847)

Fund Total: \$20,339

Established in 1998 by the estate of former UT students Elmer and Gertrude (Leasor) Brigham. Mr. Brigham was a partner in the Toledo engineering firm of Sanzenbacher, Miller & Brigham and in Caltech, one of the area's first computer consulting firms. Income from this fund provides scholarships for science students.

W. M. Bright Science Literature Fund (#300-113)

Fund Total: \$51,357

Established in 1982 by Dr. Willard M. Bright (A/S '36, MS '38), former chairman of Zoll Medical Corporation. Income from this fund provides for the acquisition of books and periodicals on the physical sciences.

Elgin C. Brooks Memorial Astronomy Scholarship (#300-963)

Fund Total: \$12,314

Established in 1999 by Helen Brooks (A/S '40, MS '55), emerita professor of astronomy, in memory of her husband, Elgin Brooks (Ed '37), retired executive with Autolite and a former lieutenant commander with the U.S. Navy. Mr. and Mrs. Brooks founded the Brooks Observatory at UT in 1987. Income from this fund provides scholarships for outstanding astronomy students.

Buckeye CableSystem Scholarship Fund (#300-538)

Fund Total: \$14,950

Established in 1995 and endowed in 1998 by Buckeye CableSystem. Income from this fund provides scholarships for full-time juniors and seniors in the department of communication, with a concentration in broadcasting. Recipients must reside in the company's franchise area and must be active in campus or community broadcast activities. The scholarship is based on academic merit and financial need.

CAI-NWO Scholarship (#300-905)*Fund Total: \$34,485*

Established in 1999 by the Chemical and Allied Industries of Northwest Ohio (CAI-NWO). Income from this fund provides scholarships to full-time undergraduates majoring in chemistry or biology, with a preference given to chemistry. Recipients must be U.S. citizens and meet academic standards.

Chemistry Faculty Scholarship Fund (#300-528)*Fund Total: \$33,137*

Established in 1989 by the department of chemistry and various donors. Income from this fund provides scholarships to students majoring in chemistry, based on scholastic merit.

Chemistry Progress Fund (#300-170)*Fund Total: \$83,653*

Established in 1987 by various donors. Income from this fund supports the needs of the department of chemistry.

Albin Czerniakowski Memorial Scholarship (#300-126)*Fund Total: \$29,713*

Established in 1983 by friends and family in memory of Albin (Beanie) Czerniakowski, former assistant clerk for the Lucas County Board of Elections. Income from this fund provides scholarships to outstanding juniors or seniors majoring in political science, based on academic merit and financial need.

William Day Scholarship Fund (#300-290)*Fund Total: \$23,535*

Established in 1993 by various donors in honor of the late William Day, adjunct professor emeritus of communication and former managing editor of The Blade. Income from this fund provides merit-based scholarships for full-time juniors who are majoring in news media and are staff members of The Independent Collegian.

Dean's Essay Prize Fund (#300-249)*Fund Total: \$13,296*

Endowed in 1997 through various contributions. Income from this fund provides awards for students in the College of Arts and Sciences, based on test scores, GPA and a short essay.

Charles DeBenedetti Memorial Scholarship in Peace and Justice (#300-168)*Fund Total: \$60,144*

Established in 1987 by various donors in memory of Dr. Charles DeBenedetti, a professor of history, an author, and a leader in peace and justice concerns until his death in 1987. Income from this fund provides scholarships to junior or senior history majors, based on academic achievement and an essay.

Sara Jane DeHoff Art Scholarship (#301-023)*Fund Total: \$48,644*

Established in 2000 by Sara Jane DeHoff, former chair of the board for the Calphalon Corp. Income from this fund provides four-year scholarships for female freshmen at UT. Recipients must be majoring in the visual arts and must demonstrate financial need and academic merit.

Lawrence J. Dessner Endowment (#300-262)*Fund Total: \$170,945*

Established in 1992 by Gerald B. Mitchell, retired chairman of the Dana Corporation, and his wife Stephanie (A/S '88) in honor of Dr. Lawrence Dessner, professor emeritus of English. Income from this fund provides emergency grants and loans to eligible students majoring in English. The fund may also be used for the purchase of scholarly materials out of the reach of the ordinary budget for library collection development.

Dr. Ernest W. Dewey Memorial Scholarship (#300-116)*Fund Total: \$32,176*

Established in 1982 by family and friends in memory of Dr. Ernest Dewey, chairman and professor of philosophy from 1966 to 1982. Income from this fund provides scholarships for full-time undergraduate students majoring in philosophy, classics, English, economics, history, foreign languages and literature, linguistics, or political science. Recipients must be U.S. citizens who demonstrate high ethical character, genuine motivation, and interest in the humanities. Awards are based on academic merit and essay, with financial need also considered.

Gladys Dils-Whiting/Beatrice Gardner Dance Scholarship (#300-239)*Fund Total: \$119,225*

Established in 1990 by the late Edgar B. Whiting, formerly with IBM and Pitney-Bowes, in memory of his wife Gladys Dils-Whiting, and in honor of her former dance instructor and friend, Beatrice Gardner. The late Nancy deCoppet Spagnola, Mrs. Dils-Whiting's stepdaughter, also endowed the fund. Income from this fund provides awards to students and instructors to participate in a summer dance program. Preference is given to third-year students.

Michael V. DiSalle Memorial Scholarship (#300-121)*Fund Total: \$62,038*

Established in 1982 by various donors in memory of Michael V. DiSalle, former Toledo mayor and the first Toledoan to become governor of Ohio. Income from this fund provides scholarships to political science undergraduate students who are especially qualified for careers in government, based on academic excellence and financial need.

Doermann Theatre Lecture Series (#300-677)*Fund Total: \$17,325*

Endowed in 2000 through gifts from various donors. Income from this fund supports lectures in the College of Arts and Sciences.

Sharron E. Doerner, Jr. Memorial Scholarship (#300-592)*Fund Total: \$13,499*

Established in 1996 and endowed in 1997 by the family and friends of Dr. Sharron (Steve) Doerner. Dr. Doerner, the former chair of the department of political science, died in 1996. Income from this fund provides scholarships for academically outstanding juniors and seniors majoring in political science.

Helen H. Edenburn Progress Fund for Geology (#300-195)*Fund Total: \$34,883*

Established in 1988 by the estate of Helen Edenburn. Income from this fund provides support for collections, including fossils, minerals and display cases, in the department of environmental sciences.

Samar El-Okdi Memorial Scholarship (#300-715)*Fund Total: \$11,514*

Established in 1997 and endowed in 2001 by various donors in memory of Samar El-Okdi (A/S '96), a patient advocate at the Center for Choice, who was killed in 1997. Income from this fund supports scholarships for students who have overcome financial, emotional or cultural barriers. Preference is given to juniors or seniors studying psychology, with an interest in anthropology or women's studies. Recipients shall be active in community service and shall meet academic standards.

Ed Foster Graduate Scholarship (#300-684)*Fund Total: \$46,418*

Established in 1996 by the late Emily Foster, retired Toledo librarian, in memory of her husband Ed, a retired faculty member of UT's physics and astronomy department and former president of the Toledo Board of Education. Income from this fund is used for awards for entering graduate students in the department of physics and astronomy.

Dr. Peter C. Fraleigh Memorial Scholarship (#301-278)*Fund Total: \$11,101*

Established in 2004 by family and friends in memory of Dr. Peter Fraleigh, retired professor of biology at UT. Income from this fund supports scholarships for undergraduate students majoring in environmental sciences. Awards are based on academic achievement and an essay.

France Stone Foundation Arts and Sciences Scholarship (#300-972)*Fund Total: \$134,718*

Established in 1999 by the France Stone Foundation. Income from this fund provides scholarships for students enrolled in the College of Arts and Sciences who demonstrate financial need.

Frontiers in Chemistry Lecture Series Fund (#300-202)*Fund Total: \$113,593*

Established in 1984 by chemistry department faculty members and other donors. Income from this fund supports the Frontiers in Chemistry Lecture Series, which sponsors research lectures by chemists from around the world.

Mahatma Gandhi Hindu Temple Fund (#301-575)*Fund Total: \$37,037*

Established in 2006 by the Hindu Temple of Toledo. Income from this fund supports public programming, presentations and lectures at UT, which reflect and commemorate the principles and philosophy of Mahatma Gandhi.

Dr. Mary Louise Glen Scholarship Fund (#300-881)*Fund Total: \$32,167*

Established in 1998 by Dr. Mary Louise Glen (MEd '62, EdS '74, EdD '77), UT professor of sociology. Income from this

fund provides scholarships for female sociology majors entering their second year of undergraduate study. Preference is given to nontraditional students with outstanding academic performance.

Ernest W. Gray Prize Fund (#301-167)*Fund Total: \$40,024*

Established in 2002 by an anonymous donor in memory of Dr. Ernest Gray, former UT Honors director and chair of the English Department. Income from this fund supports an annual award for graduating English majors, based on academic achievement and an essay.

George P. Guthrie Scholarship in Philosophy (#300-661)*Fund Total: \$24,406*

Established in 1996 by Dr. Charles Terbill (A/S '65, MALIS '75), former UT reference librarian, in honor of Dr. George Guthrie, UT professor emeritus of philosophy. Income from this fund provides scholarships to undergraduate or graduate philosophy students, based on scholastic merit.

Fred O. Hartman Scholarship (#301-403)*Fund Total: \$9,598*

Established in 2005 by Dr. Fred O. Hartman (A/S '37), professor emeritus of The Ohio State University. Income from this fund provides merit-based scholarships to undergraduate biology students.

Ottalie E. Hassensall Music Scholarship (#300-352)*Fund Total: \$211,055*

Established by the estate of Ottalie Hassensall. Income from this fund supports scholarships for music students under age 30.

Franklyn and Hilda Hawkins Scholarship (#300-502)*Fund Total: \$218,897*

Established in 1994 by the estate of Franklyn Hawkins (A/S '31), former advertising manager for the Libbey-Owens-Ford Co., and his wife Hilda. Income from this fund provides scholarships to pre-medical students, based on merit and financial need.

Robert and Esther Heil Scholarship (#301-705)*Fund Total: \$206,255*

Established in 2008 by the estate of Robert Heil (Ed '36) and his wife Esther. Income from this fund provides scholarships to students demonstrating financial need and showing scholastic promise in language, math and science.

David Hostetler Memorial Scholarship (#300-124)*Fund Total: \$45,422*

Established in 1983 by friends and family in memory of David Hostetler (MS '58), a Sun Oil chemist and UT Community and Technical College instructor of analytical chemistry from 1968 until 1983. Income from this fund provides scholarships to sophomores majoring in chemistry who meet academic standards.

Humanities Scholarship Fund (#300-351)*Fund Total: \$33,105*

Established by various donors. Income from this fund supports scholarships, based on need and merit, for students majoring in one of the humanities.

International Physicians of Northwest Ohio Merit Scholarship Fund (#300-188)

Fund Total: \$16,050

Established in 1988 by the Association of International Physicians of Northwest Ohio. Income from this fund provides scholarships to full-time undergraduate students majoring in pre-medicine, based on academic achievement. Recipients must be legal U.S. residents who are foreign-born or whose parent is foreign-born.

Joan L. and Julius H. Jacobson II Endowed Professorship in Biomedical Research Fund (#300-749)

Fund Total: \$1,051,518

Established in 1997 by Dr. Julius H. Jacobson II (A/S '47) and his wife Joan. Dr. Jacobson, director emeritus of vascular surgery at Mt. Sinai Medical Center in New York City, received an honorary doctorate from UT in 1997. Income from this fund supports an endowed professorship in biomedical research.

Edwin Jayamaha Scholarship (#301-786)

Fund Total: \$29,079

Established in 2009 by Dr. Upali Jayamaha (MS '92, PhD '95), in memory of his father Edwin. Income from this fund supports merit-based scholarships for UT students who are planning careers in renewable energy and preferably are minoring in renewable energy. Recipients shall be majoring in physics and shall participate in the Choose Ohio First Scholarship program, "Building Ohio's Sustainable Energy Future."

Saraswathi Jayanthi Memorial Scholarship Fund (#301-134)

Fund Total: \$22,136

Established in 2002 by the late Dr. Chidambaraswamy Jayanthi, professor emeritus of mathematics, in memory of his wife Saraswathi. Income from this fund supports scholarships for outstanding math majors in their junior or senior year.

L. JaFran Jones Memorial Visiting Musician and Scholarship Fund (#300-728)

Fund Total: \$12,792

Established in 1997 by E. Sharon Jones in memory of her sister, Dr. L. JaFran Jones, chair of the department of music at the time of her death in 1997. Income from this fund is used to fund visiting musicians as well as scholarships for undergraduate music majors.

O. Garfield Jones Memorial Scholarship (#300-003)

Fund Total: \$43,661

Established in 1961 by the late Nellie Jones in memory of her husband Dr. O. Garfield Jones, former professor of political science and UT athletic director. Income from this fund provides scholarships to sophomores, juniors, and seniors in the College of Arts and Sciences, with preference given to political science majors.

Fern Kalmbach Memorial Scholarship Fund (#301-217)

Fund Total: \$314,284

Established in 2003 by the estate of Fern Kalmbach, a commercial artist and freelance writer/poet. Income from this fund supports scholarships for the two juniors majoring or minoring in English who show the greatest creative writing

skill. Recipients must be male and must demonstrate academic achievement .

Imam Khattab Endowed Chair of Islamic Studies (#300-792)

Fund Total: \$827,918

Established in 1997 by various donors and renamed in 2001 in memory of Imam Abdelmoneim Mahmoud Khattab, imam of the Islamic Center of Greater Toledo for 18 years. Income from this fund currently supports an endowed chair in Islamic Studies.

Edgar T. Kilbride Memorial Scholarship Fund (#300-167)

Fund Total: \$13,335

George Ballas Athletic Scholarship Fund (#301-194)

Fund Total: \$58,898

Established in 2003 by various donors in memory of George Ballas, president of George Ballas Buick GMC. Income from

Fund Total: \$22,338

Established in 1972 by various donors. Income from this fund provides scholarships for active career and technical education

teachers/instructors in a comprehensive high school, career high school, career center or B.V.R. center, who hold a five-year professional license and have completed a minimum of 27 hours of teaching. Recipients must be full- or part-time undergraduate or graduate students in UT's career and technical education program, and active members of the Association for Career and Technical Education and an Ohio Career and Technical Education Student Organization. Financial need and academic merit are considered.

Dr. Joseph C. Christen Endowment (#301-302)

Fund Total: \$10,325

Established in 2006 by family and friends in memory of Dr. Joseph Christen (PhD '89), director of organizational and leadership development at UT and a former vice president of The Andersons. William W. and Ella P. Stewart Scholarship (#300-377)

Established in 1995 by the estate of writer Jane Eberly Eager (A/S '33), sister-in-law of the late Catharine Eberly, a former member of the UT Board of Trustees. Established in 1980 through the initiative of the late Dr. William Kneller, former chair of UT’s geology department, and endowed with the help of other donors. Income from this fund provides awards to professors or students working in silicate science, which includes petrology, mineralogy, high temperature physical chemistry, and physics.

Joel and Davie Epstein Scholarship Fund (#300-953)

Fund Total: \$19,211

Established in 1999 and endowed in 2001 by Joel (A/S ‘68) and Davie Epstein (Ed ‘69, MEd ‘86). Awards are based on financial need and an essay.

Fund Total: \$63,304

Established in 2006 through the estate of Bernice Husted (Ed '32). Income from this fund is used for programming and activities of the UT Alumni Association.

Information Technology Scholarship (#300-645)

Fund Total: \$13,837

Endowed in 2004 by various donors. Income from this fund supports scholarships for UT undergraduate students majoring in an area closely related to information/computer technology. Recipients must be U.S. citizens and demonstrate merit and need.

fund provides scholarships for UT students within one or two semesters of receiving a bachelor's degree. Recipients must show academic ability, with preference given to those with financial need and community service.

Fund Total: \$202,870

NEG Endowment for Silicate Science (#300-302)*Fund Total: \$2,320,876*

Established in 1989 by Nippon Electric Glass. Income from this fund supports an endowed chair in silicate science.

David Neufeld Memorial Scholarship (#300-381)*Fund Total: \$18,971*

Established in 1979 by the late Dr. Oscar Neufeld and his wife Mary in memory of their son David, and increased in 1994 by contributions of other donors in memory of David's brother Ronald. Income from this fund provides scholarships to UT students in any college based on merit and need.

Dr. Daniel B. Neusom Memorial Scholarship (#300-286)*Fund Total: \$17,313*

Established in 1988 by the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity. Income from this fund supports book scholarships for full-time students with financial need who meet academic standards. First preference is given to graduate and undergraduate students who are members of UT's Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity chapter.

Presidents Club Fund (#100-400)*Fund Total: \$2,385,055*

This fund supports various academic needs and programs throughout the University, including the Frank E. Horton Presidents Club Scholarships.

Presidents Endowment for Minority Scholarships (#100-250)*Fund Total: \$612,996*

Established in 1990 by the UT Foundation through unrestricted funds. Income from this fund provides matching funds for donor gifts targeted for minority scholarships.

The Jesse W. and Leona Greene Probst Scholarship (#300-164)*Fund Total: \$20,535*

Established in 1986 by the late Leona Greene Probst (A/S '26), a retired teacher and administrator in Toledo schools. The fund was increased through her estate in 1989. Income from this fund provides scholarships to undergraduate students in any college, based on financial need and academic achievement.

Professional Staff Association Scholarship (#300-547)*Fund Total: \$25,782*

Endowed in 2003 by UT's Professional Staff Association. Income from this fund supports scholarships to full- or part-time students, based on academic standards and recommendations.

Program for Academic Excellence/Strategic Enhancement Awards Fund (#100-200)*Fund Total: \$1,790,636*

Established by the UT Foundation through unrestricted gifts. Income from this fund, along with other funding, is used for UT's Program for Academic Excellence (PAE). The PAE supports program enhancements, faculty awards, and other academic purposes throughout the University.

Dion Raftopoulos/Sigma Xi Award for Outstanding Research (#300-095)*Fund Total: \$53,640*

Established in 1983 by Dr. Demetrios Raftopoulos, professor emeritus of bioengineering and past president of the Toledo Chapter of Sigma Xi, in memory of his son Dion, a superior pre-medicine student until his death in 1978. The fund was established with the assistance of Adolph N. Witt, former president of the UT Chapter of Sigma Xi. Income from this fund provides outstanding research awards for full-time faculty.

William Rhodes and Jean Clark Rhodes Fund (#301-608)*Fund Total: \$485,265*

Established in 2007 through the estate of retired teachers H. William (Ed '65) and Jean Clark Rhodes (A/S '51, MEd '79). Income from this fund is used for scholarships and financial assistance for students in financial distress. Recipients shall be non-traditional students with need and merit.

The Dorothy Riess Scholarship (#300-925)*Fund Total: \$115,938*

Established in 1999 by the estate of Dorothy Riess. Income from this fund provides scholarships for single mothers pursuing an undergraduate degree at UT, with preference given to active

participants of Mom's House in Toledo. Recipients must be U.S. citizens residing in the Toledo area and must demonstrate financial need and meet academic standards.

Edward C. and Helen G. Schmakel Scholarship (#300-125)*Fund Total: \$74,254*

Established in 1983 by the late Edward Schmakel (Ed '38, MEd '68), UT's alumni director emeritus, and his late wife Helen. Income from this fund provides scholarships to Blue Key members. Awards are based on campus involvement, community service, philanthropic participation, leadership qualities, and academic achievement.

Schmakel Alumni Center Maintenance Fund (#300-275)*Fund Total: \$19,627*

Established in 1995 by various donors in honor of the late Edward Schmakel (Ed '38, MEd '68), UT's alumni director emeritus, to renovate and maintain the Schmakel Alumni Center.

Charlotte R. Schmidlapp Scholarship (#301-655)*Fund Total: \$246,726*

Established in 2007 by Fifth Third Bank, through the Charlotte R. Schmidlapp Fund. Income from this fund provides scholarships for female UT students who are studying in the area of technology programs, specifically the joint degree program offered through the College of Business Administration and the College of Engineering. Students must be residents of Ohio, with first preference given to those from Piqua or the Greater Cincinnati area.

Daisy B. Scott - BPW/Toledo Fund (#300-536)*Fund Total: \$13,499*

Established in 1990 by the Business and Professional Women of Toledo, in honor of former BPW member Daisy Scott. Income from this fund supports scholarships and the Women's Resource Center at the Catharine S. Eberly Center for Women.

Cleveland and Zonia Sherman Fund (#300-970)*Fund Total: \$25,001*

Endowed in 2010 through the estate of Ruth Ann Thomas, a retired math teacher, and others, in honor of long-time friends and advocates for education, Cleveland and Zonia Sherman. Income from this fund provides scholarships for African-American undergraduate students, based on academic standards, financial need and volunteer service.

Emney M. and Yehia H. Shousher Fund (#301-394)*Fund Total: \$9,774*

Established in 2006 by retired businessman Yehia (John) and his wife, Emney, in honor of Rafie Hairi, former prime minister of Lebanon. Income from this fund provides scholarships for UT students, with preference given to students of Arab-Lebanese descent.

Sigma Beta Phi - Phi Kappa Psi (Last Man's Club) Scholarship (#300-018)*Fund Total: \$102,261*

Established by members of Sigma Beta Phi. Income from this fund provides scholarships to current and new fraternity members who are full-time undergraduates. Awards are based on academic

standards, leadership qualities and citizenship, and commitment to the advancement of the fraternity system.

Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity Ohio Iota Chapter/Balanced Man Scholarship (#300-144)

Fund Total: \$52,148

Mr. Stanfa was an employee of the Textileleather Company. Income from this fund supports scholarships for graduates of Central Catholic High School in Toledo. Scholarships are based on financial need and academic achievement, with preference given to children of single-parent households.

Virginia Stranahan Endowed Fund (#300-730)

Fund Total: \$43,927

Established in 1997 by the estate of Toledo area volunteer and philanthropist Virginia Stranahan, who received an honorary doctorate from the University in 1965. Income from this fund is

used for the University's priority needs, as determined by the UT Board of Trustees.

Fund Total: \$15,998

Established in 2005 by the UT Student Alumni Association (SAA). Income from this fund provides scholarships for members of the SAA, based on involvement in the organization and academic achievement.

Charles Stundon Scholarship (#300-414)

Fund Total: \$265,122

Established in 1992 by the estate of George Stundon, a retired Sun Oil employee, in memory of his brother Charles. Income from this fund provides scholarships to National Merit Scholars.

George W. Stundon Scholarship (#300-413)

Fund Total: \$253,265

Established in 1992 by the estate of George Stundon. Income from this fund underwrites scholarships for National Merit Scholars.

Delmer J. and Lillian M. Sullivan Memorial Scholarship (#300-761)

Fund Total: \$102,119

Established in 1998 by the estate of Delmer and Lillian Sullivan. Income from this fund is used for loans to UT students meeting academic standards and having financial need.

Patricia Ann Sullivan Alumni Honor Scholarship (#300-476)

Fund Total: \$1,588,968

Established in 1995 by Charles A. Sullivan (Bus '59), retired chairman and CEO of Interstate Bakeries Corp., in memory of his first wife. Mr. Sullivan is former chair of the UT Foundation Board of Trustees. Income from this fund provides scholarships to freshmen, based on merit, extracurricular activities, community service, and leadership qualities.

William and Dyreese Sweeney Scholarship Fund (#301-305)

Fund Total: \$9,057

Established in 2004 and endowed in 2007 by William Sweeney (A/S '74) and his wife Dyreese (Ed '73). Mr. Sweeney is a regional sales director for Roche Laboratories, and Mrs. Sweeney is a math tutor. Income from this fund supports merit- and need-based scholarships for UT students, alternating yearly between pharmacy and secondary education majors.

He is a member of the UT Foundation Board of Trustees and former president of the UT Alumni Association. Mrs. Talmage (MEd '65) is also a former president of the UT Alumni Association and a former member of the UT Foundation Board of Trustees. Income from this fund provides scholarships for juniors majoring in education and pre-med. Awards are based on campus and community activity, scholastic achievement and financial need.

Tasker Family Fund (#300-707)

Fund Total: \$28,828

Established in 1996 by the late Edwin Tasker, former CEO of Toledo Stamping, through the Tasker Family Limited Partnership. Income from this fund is used for scholarships for UT entering freshmen from a rural or county high school, who demonstrate financial need and academic merit.

Toledo Business Partners in Academic Excellence Fund (#300-835)

Fund Total: \$19,911

Established in 1998 by area businesses through UT's Corporate Annual Fund. Toledo Council of Jewish Women (#300-036)

Fund Total: \$31,529

Established in 1975 by the Toledo Section of the National Council of Jewish Women. Income provides scholarships to female students with need and excellent academic credentials.

The Toledo Host Lions Club Welfare Fund, Inc. Endowed Scholarship Fund (#300-823)

Fund Total: \$11,061

Established in 1998 by the Toledo Host Lions Club Welfare Fund, Inc. Income from this fund provides scholarships for students who are legally disabled due to sight impairment or blindness. Recipients should be full-time students who are U.S. citizens, are residents of northwest Ohio or southeast Michigan, and who demonstrate financial need and academic merit.

The Jeffrey and Nancy Traudt Scholarship (#300-509)

Fund Total: \$14,875

Established in 1994 and endowed in 1998 by Jeffrey Traudt (Bus '79) and his wife Nancy. Mr. Traudt is the owner of the Jeff Traudt State Farm Insurance Agency, past president of the UT

Alumni Association and a former member of the UT Foundation Board of Trustees. Income from this fund supports scholarships for UT freshmen who are graduates of St. Ursula Academy. Recipients must meet academic standards and demonstrate financial need.

UT Foundation General Scholarship (#100-141)

Fund Total: \$786,869

Established in 1987 by various gifts through the UT Alumni Foundation (a predecessor to the UT Foundation). Income from this fund provides scholarships through UT's Admissions Office.

UT Health Science Campus Bookstore Scholarship Fund (#500-199)

Fund Total: \$7,164

Established in 1996 and endowed in 2006 through gifts and bookstore fundraisers. Income from this fund provides book scholarships for nontraditional students with need and merit.

UT Health Science Campus Retirees Fund (#500-260)

Fund Total: \$19,283

Established in 1999 by various donors. Income from this fund provides scholarships for students with high academic standards and need, who demonstrate a sense of service to school and community. Scholarships are given to students in each of the Health Science Campus colleges.

UT/Mercy Center for Creative Education (#500-245)

Fund Total: \$2,670,697

Established in 1998 by Mercy Health Partners and others. Income from this fund supported construction of, and ongoing assistance for the maintenance of, the Center for Creative Education.

UTRA Scholarship Fund (#301-163)

Fund Total: \$22,435

Established in 2003 by members of the University of Toledo Retirees Association (UTRA). Income from this fund provides

scholarships for full-time juniors or seniors who are descendants of retired UT faculty and staff who are dues-paying UTRA members. Awards are based on academic merit and activities.

Unidos y Diversos-Latino Student Union Scholarship (#301-341)

Fund Total: \$25,479

Established in 2005 by the UT Latino Student Union. Income from this fund provides scholarships for UT undergraduate students, with preference given to Latino/Hispanic students. Awards are based on academic merit and financial need, as well as involvement in the organization, campus and community.

University Women’s Club Nontraditional Student Scholarship Fund (#300-649)

Fund Total: \$20,270

Established in 1996 by members of the University Women’s Club. Income from this fund supports scholarships for nontraditional female juniors and seniors at UT. Recipients must demonstrate academic achievement and financial need.

University Women’s Commission Scholarship (#300-379)

Fund Total: \$37,453

Established in 1989 by the University Women’s Commission. Income from this fund provides scholarships to female undergraduate students meeting scholastic requirements and showing financial need.

Fund Total: \$1,007,575

Established in 1988 and revised through an estate gift in 1996 by the late Carmye (Virginia) Winkle in memory of her husband Harry R. Winkle, retired vice chair and CFO for Owens Corning. He received an honorary doctorate from the University in 1964. Income from this fund is used for scholarships.

Mr. and Mrs. H.R. Winkle Unrestricted Fund (#300-648)

Fund Total: \$1,058,367

Established in 1988 and revised through an estate gift in 1996 by the late Carmye (Virginia) Winkle in memory of her husband Harry R. Winkle, retired vice chair and CFO for Owens Corning. Income from this fund is to be used for the University’s priority needs, as determined by the UT Board of Trustees.

Fund Total: \$1,231,706

Established in 2008 through funding from Ohio Third Frontier Research and Development. Income from this fund supports an endowed chair in photovoltaics.

Fund Total: \$18,388

Established in 1956 by the Phi Alpha Theta history honorary society. Income from this fund supports awards for an outstanding male junior or senior majoring in history.

Fund Total: \$22,489

Established in 1974 through a bequest by Dr. Irwin Stover. Income from this fund provides awards for pre-med students, based on financial need and academic merit.

John F. Savage Basketball Scholarship

Fund Total: \$66,810

Established in 1993 by a bequest by the late John F. Savage (Ed ‘52), co-founder of Savage & Associates. Mr. Savage was a former chair of both the UT Board of Trustees and the UT Foundation Board of Trustees, and past president of the UT Alumni Association. He received an honorary doctorate from the University in 1985. Income from this fund supports scholarships for participants in the UT’s women’s basketball program.
