

UToledo Holds Inauguration Ceremony for Dr. James Holloway, the University's 19th president, on Oct. 16



The University of Toledo celebrated the Inauguration of Dr. James Holloway with a ceremony filled with tradition and promise for the institution's future.

The event began with hundreds of UToledo faculty, administrators, students and representatives from other universities walking in a processional from the Thompson Student Union to Savage Arena. The formal ceremony officially installed the President with the presentation of the Articles of Incorporation from the University's founding on Oct. 12, 1872 and the medallion worn around by the president at all formal academic occasions.

The ceremony included greetings and gifts from

leaders of key University groups on the stage, video messages from U.S. Rep. Marcy Kaptur and Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine, and a welcome video with messages from groups across campus.

In his Inauguration Address, Holloway shared his vision for UToledo, which is summarized in his Annual Report welcome letter on page 2.

"Today is about the reaffirmation of a purpose, the renewal of a promise and the recognition of pride. Purpose, promise and pride," Holloway began his remarks. "Today is about who we are as a university. And so, I start by declaring this: From our founding, we have never been simply a university in Toledo. Rather, we have ever been The University for Toledo."

Holloway acknowledged the challenges facing UToledo and higher education more broadly, nodding to the University's history of weathering difficult times before and looking forward with action.

To accomplish the goals expressed in his address, the President announced a UToledo Extension effort that will create a one-stop shop for external partners to connect with the University.

Holloway ended his address asking the audience to imagine The University of Toledo in five years with strong success across our education, research, healthcare and athletic missions in a region where the University and industry are working more collaboratively than ever before.

Leaving a Legacy: Tom and Mary Wakefield Maximize Campus Impact with Planned Gift

As proud alumni of The University of Toledo, **Tom '75, '78 and Mary '76 Wakefield** have always believed that education has the power to change lives. Their deep connection to the University and the opportunities it opened for them, including their own Rocket Romance, has inspired them to give back. From annual contributions that support student success to thoughtful planned gifts that will sustain the University's mission for generations to come, the Wakefields exemplify how alumni can make a lasting impact.

"The University of Toledo gave us our start," shared Tom. The couple met between the Lancelot Thompson Student Union and Carlson Library more than 50 years ago. Their first date was at a men's basketball game in Memorial Field House, launching a decades-long love story, having now been married more than 48 years.



Tom was a first-generation college student, and he credits his UToledo education with providing him the foundation he needed to go on to medical school at the Medical College of Ohio (now The University of Toledo College of Medicine and Life Sciences). Dr. Wakefield spent 45 years as a vascular surgeon at the University of Michigan, 16 years as head of Vascular Surgery and 8 years as a director of the Samuel and Jean Frankel Cardiovascular Center.

For Mary, her UToledo education gave her the opportunity to explore her passions and find a career in an environment that was positive and nurturing. Ultimately, she decided on physical therapy and spent more than 20 years as a patient-oriented physical therapist at the University of Michigan Medical Center.

The Wakefields expressed, "we both felt an intense personal investment from our alma mater – we were not just a number." Although they now live in Michigan, the couple still feels a deep connection to the institution, which has inspired them to give back through their time and philanthropy.

"We both see great benefit in supporting our hometown institution. UToledo is a real jewel! Its success is important for the entire region. Any small measure we can take to augment that success is especially important to us," they continued.

Initially, the couple began supporting UToledo Athletics. Tom

grew up a Rocket fan, attending competitions with his father including every home game and many away games during the historic 35-0 Rocket Football season of 1969-1971 and every home game during the Men's Basketball season of 1967, when the team went 23-2.

Over time, the Wakefields discovered diverse areas to support based on their personal interests. "Mary especially wanted to support the Eberly Center and The University of Toledo Business Incubator," said Tom. The couple also supports UToledo's College of Medicine and Life Sciences, which includes starting a Wakefield Scholarship for medical students. Additionally, Tom supports UToledo with the gift of time and participation. He served the Alumni Association and was its President from 2014-2015, and currently serves on the UToledo Foundation Board of Trustees and is a national trustee on the UToledo Board of Trustees.

Most recently, the Wakefields made a major commitment to the Champions Complex, which will provide the needed infrastructure for Rocket Athletics and our student athletes. "We see the value in providing a space that supports students, whether it is nutrition, counseling or academic support," added Tom.

"Giving to our alma mater makes us happy, knowing we can continue to help make a difference in the lives of current UToledo students in the same way that The University of Toledo made a huge difference in our lives. We want to pay it forward," shared the couple.

By creating a planned gift with the UToledo Foundation, the Wakefields made sure their support would leave a lasting legacy. "By making a planned gift, we can ensure our support for UToledo will continue. As we considered how we would like our estate to be managed, we wanted a part to support our alma mater, the place that gave us our start," Tom expressed.

The Wakefields were grateful to have options that allowed them to give back in a variety of ways. They shared, "The [UToledo Foundation] team collaborates with potential donors and makes those plans happen in a way that honors their intentions. We advise anyone considering a planned gift to consider how they want to make a lasting impact on UToledo and then design a plan that will allow for future success."

Whether through our annual Rocket Forward Day of Giving, endowed scholarships, or planned gifts, such as bequests or charitable gift annuities, every contribution helps strengthen the University's mission and enriches experiences for our students. Every action helps continue UToledo's traditions and powers lasting change for future generations.






